











# European Development Days Auditorium Debate: "Global citizens can change the world!"

4<sup>th</sup> June 2015, 15.30-17.00

#### **Background:**

In a global and interdependent world, the promotion of global citizenship is essential for citizens to understand that their individual and collective actions have a global impact and for them to be able to engage in positive actions for their communities and the planet. Global Citizenship can be promoted in several ways (education, policy changes, campaigns and global citizens' movements) by several stakeholders (CSO, Governments, Municipalities, International Organisations...) while always keeping its universal values of Justice, Democratic Participation, Diversity, Empathy, and Global Solidarity at the core of its position.

The Sustainable Development Goals are an opportunity to put Global Citizenship at the heart of the global development agenda and our joint construction for a peaceful, fair and sustainable world. In this Auditorium Debate the organising partners (CONCORD, DEEEP, CIVICUS, GENE, ALDA and North-South Centre) will present different ways to put Global Citizenship in action. It will be followed by an interactive discussion on how to support citizens' engagement in the implementation of the new development agenda and ensuring global justice for all.

We aim to show that everyone can have a role to play in the promotion of Global Citizenship. We will answer these 3 questions:

- What is Global Citizenship?
- Why is it important to engage citizens in global development?
- What has to be done to increase its reach?

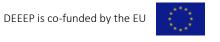
