Introduction

This Conference/Event will take place between the 11th-13th November in Malta. It is being organised in the framework of the LADDER Project as part of activities to promote development awareness within the European Year for Development 2015. The LADDER Project aims to develop and increase awareness and action of Local Authorities and Civil Society in EU Development and Awareness Raising policies and practice, enabling them to become multipliers of Change.

The project focuses on 6 themes and will organise 6 special initiatives across three years. SOS Malta is hosting the first event focused on the theme of migration and development. Given the Valletta Summit on migration taking place at the same time in Malta, this conference will provide an opportune moment to discuss the global perspectives of migration and how this affects development worldwide, whilst focusing on action that can be taken at the local level to combat challenges caused by migration, harness positive forces of migration and raise awareness of the issue of migration globally.
